From the Study Matthew 8:18-22 (NIV UK)

19 Then a teacher of the law came to him and said, 'Teacher, I will follow you wherever you go.'

20 Jesus replied, 'Foxes have dens and birds have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head.'

21 Another disciple said to him, 'Lord, first let me go and bury my father.'

22 But Jesus told him, 'Follow me, and let the dead bury their own dead.'

Most of us never stop to consider the true cost of following Jesus. We usually measure 'cost' in monetary terms, but in relation to our life in Christ that which we put in the collection plate is of little value in a priceless relationship.

Jesus calls us to follow Him even though, as He told the lawyer, 'the Son of man has nowhere to lay his head'. Will you still worship and follow Jesus if you should lose your home, or your job, or a loved one?

Someone said to Jesus, 'Lord, first let me go and bury my father'. You may think Jesus' answer was a little unkind, 'Follow me, and let the dead bury their own dead', but it's important to know the context - this person wasn't asking Jesus to wait till after the

funeral, he was asking Jesus to wait until he had collected his inheritance, his father wasn't dead yet.

What is the cost of following Jesus? I cannot tell you, that's between Jesus and you, however, I can tell you the reward will be far greater than anything you could ever ask or imagine when you stand in the presence of God.


