Thank You Lord, Amen.



further) into poverty as a result. There will be a knock-on effect for us too over the coming years as food shortages or temporary gaps in the market of some products, mean inevitable price rises. That will of course affect the least well-off the most and the continued need for food banks and other such like projects demonstrate how broken the food system is. We have supported the Eastside Foodbank for a numbers of years at Aenon, along with Matthew's House for our fresh food from harvest thanksgiving for several years, but whilst these are a great way of demonstrating our care for others in need in our own city, it is too bad that projects of this nature are needed at all. Food waste levels across the UK are still too high, and yet there are those who are hungry and cannot afford to buy food for their family.

The theme of the ecumenical Season of Creation 2024 is to 'Hope and Act with Creation'. This is an invitation to put our ultimate hope in God, as the Sustainer of all things and respond with action, to safeguard and protect our common home – nature and the planet. We all need to play our part by being more mindful and thoughtful about what we buy, where we buy from, how we use it and what happens to if afterwards, so that we 'tread more lightly' on the earth.

ECO-CHURCH

This month we are celebrating our harvest thanksgiving. The time of year when we *especially* thank God for all that we are provided with- our food and provisions. We are thankful to the farmers and others who grow our food, who help look after it and tend it and who harvest it for us to enjoy. Churches often also use this time to think about creation in a more focused way. Some denominations celebrate a whole season – the Season of Creation, or 'Creationtide' which looks to God as Creator and Sustainer of all living things. Some will hold special services to dig deeper with creation care theology, pray for the natural world and take action through events and activities to safeguard and care for the earth.

The Season of Creation started on 1st of September with the Feast of Creation (also known as Day of Prayer for Creation, or Creation Day) and ends on 4th of October with the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, who is thought to be the patron saint of ecology.

But as we have learnt over the past few years in the process of gaining our Silver Eco Church award, the creation (and so ecology) is suffering as species of animals and plants are struggling to survive, falling in population or facing total extinction. This is largely down to human actions and accelerating climate change. But there are also consequences for food and produce. Extreme weather conditions like severe floods, heatwaves, droughts and huge wildfires are becoming more commonplace and more unpredictable- even closer to home in parts of Europe. This means that crops are being severely damaged or failing completely, and so livelihoods are being taken away in the blink of an eye. Many thousands will be pushed (often


