

- Make your own gift tags: you can recycle parts from the cards you received last year or cut out seasonal shapes from colourful card packaging.
- Consider a gift that keeps on giving such as a plant or membership to a wildlife or heritage charity
- Don't be tempted to buy food that you don't like, just because its 'traditional'

Facts about Christmas waste:

The additional waste generated during Christmas could fill 50,000 double-decker buses.

Every Christmas, the amount of waste produced in the UK increases 30 %, according to a study by Biffa. That includes an estimated 365,000 kilometres of unrecyclable wrapping paper-enough to wrap around the equator nine times and 1 billion cards that end up in the bin.

The UK discards approximately 8 million real Christmas trees each year. Landfilled real trees can release up to 16 kg of CO2 as they decompose. Artificial trees, often made of non-recyclable plastic, require at least 10 years of use to offset their environmental impact compared to real trees.

Each family wastes an average of £60 worth of food over the Christmas period.

The UK discards over 500 tonnes of Christmas lights annually.

ECO-Matters

Christmas preparation

It probably won't surprise you that this month's 'eco matters' is all about Christmas and some of the ways that we can all reduce at least some of the impact we have during this season. The aim isn't to take away from the celebrations but to balance enjoyment with thoughtful, sustainable actions. Tell your family and friends about them too.

Small changes like recycling properly, avoiding single-use items, and planning ahead of time can all have a positive impact.

- Check all your Christmas lights and if you need to buy make sure they are LED to minimise energy use; have outdoor lights on timer so that they are only turned on after dark and until bedtime.
- Avoid greetings cards and wrapping paper with foil or glitter as they cannot be recycled with paper and card.
- Shop local for gifts and look out for local crafts to minimise the carbon footprint of your presents, or make some yourself, like.....
- Think about giving homemade preserves or baked treats - you could even make up a small local produce hamper for a special friend or neighbour.
- If you give toiletries, look for those that are ecofriendly and contain no palm oil. Shampoo bars, solid soap and other toiletries, sold without any plastic packaging.
